Parent Carers support groups/drop ins offer a safe place to let off steam, to feel secure to talk about any feelings we have and to celebrate the highs of parenting together. These groups give people a sense of community and a sense of belonging which is a basic human need for us all. Research has identified that belonging to groups is most important for your health. Attending groups increases your level of social connections which helps protect your mental health. The groups offer familiarity – meeting at a regular time, in a regular venue, with a regular facilitator and interesting speakers. The door is always open to welcome new parents and carers to our groups. We look forward to seeing you all in the New Year.

#### **UMBRELLA FUNDRAISING**

#### One man, one ocean, the world's toughest row

Vic Handley has been a friend of Umbrella for over 10 years. You'll often see him at one of our events or supporting a fundraising activity.

In the summer of this year, Vic contacted us to share his plans of solo rowing the Atlantic to celebrate his 70th birthday in 2024 and in doing so, his wish to raise money for four local charities, Derby County Community Trust, Derbyshire Mind, Enthusiasm and Umbrella.





The row, which will take him 3,000 miles from La Gomera in the Canary Islands to Antigua in the Caribbean, is due to start on December 12, 2024, giving Vic a whole year to get into training for the challenge as well as secure his equipment, food and the support he'll need to power him on his way.

Vic has been inspired to name his boat The City of Derby, which he unveiled at a naming ceremony at Pride Park Stadium.

A host of dignitaries, including Derby Mayor Councillor Alan Graves, Lord Lieutenant of Derbyshire Liz Fothergill and the High Sheriff of Derbyshire, Theresa Peltier, joined him at the launch, alongside members of his family, well-wishers and representatives from the four charities.

## Have Your Say on PlayZones in Derby Parks



Derby City Council is consulting with the local community regarding their thoughts for PlayZones in four Derby parks, which include Caxton Park in Normanton, Dale Road Park in Spondon, Knightsbridge Recreation Ground in Mackworth and Stockbrook Recreation Ground in Abbey. PlayZones are safe, inclusive and accessible outdoor facilities that aim to bring communities together through various forms of recreational activities. The PlayZones would be funded using investment from the Premier League, The FA and the Government through Sport England, in partnership with Derby City Council. This is an exciting new project looking at renovating old Multi-

Use Games Areas (MUGAs) into PlayZones and building new PlayZones from scratch. The project aims to tackle inequalities in physical activity and provide access to high-quality community facilities in local, accessible spaces.

Your input matters. Join our consultation on Let's Talk Derby, shaping the PlayZones design and management. Let's build vibrant, welcoming spaces together." The consultation document and response form are available online on Let's Talk Derby. The eight week consultation period closes at midnight on Tuesday 30 January 2024. After the closing date, the Council will gather all the responses received and this will inform the project development of PlayZones in each park.
